Born in the village of Onalua in central Congo, Lumumba rose from humble beginnings to become a passionate advocate for African self-determination. A gifted orator and thinker, he galvanized his people with a vision of a united, prosperous, and sovereign Congo, free from colonial exploitation. His leadership challenged the oppressive structures of Belgian colonialism, which had plundered Congo's vast resources while subjecting its people to brutal subjugation. Lumumba's uncompromising stance on true independence made him a global symbol of resistance against imperialism.

Despite his brief tenure as Prime Minister, Lumumba's impact was profound. For us, his sacrifice is a reminder that the path to liberation demands courage, sacrifice, and an unbreakable belief in the power of our people.

We as the leadership collective and volunteers of Mayibuye Consultation Process gain optimal inspiration and courage from Lumumba as we embark on a journey that will culminate in revolutionary decisions and actions. In our compilation and Listening sessions, we will be guided by the fighting spirit of Patrice Lumumba, and our collective resolve will be to honour his contribution to revolutionary change.

Lumumba's vision of a united Africa, free from division and exploitation, resonates deeply with the Mayibuye Consultation Process.
